- Publication of the IYGU books as open Access publication by Springer are on the way. The volume on Eating/Drinking//Surviving edited by Peter Jackson, Farhana Sultana and Walter Spiess is already in production and will be available for the International Geographical Congress in Beijing, August xy-xy. The volume on Working/Housing//Urbanizing by Allen Scott, Peter Taylor and Jennifer Robinson as well as the one by Margaret Robertson on xy/xy//xy are close completion and will go in production in the next days or weeks.

- The IYGU panel session during the American Association of Geographers annual meeting in San Francisco, 29 March 2 April included the participation of the executive director of AAG, Doug Richardson, the director of National



Geographic xy, past president of IGU, Ronald Abler, the iYGU patron and CEO of ESRI, jack Dangermond etc.

- Presentation of IYGU at the UNESCO Inception Symposium on Broadening the Application of the Sustainability Science Approach in support of 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, held at the Paris UNESCO Headquarters 5–6 April 2016. The broadening of sustainability research is referring to the stronger inclusion of the social and human sciences, exactly in the way as IYGU is proposing it.
- Presentation of the IYGU at the Geographical Association Annual Conference, at the University of Manchester from 7-9 April leading to new co-operations.
- Participation of the IYGU The Fourth Annual Conference of Taihu World Cultural Forum with a presentation at the Plenary session. It was attended by high ranked representatives of the Chinese government.
- A national wide conference took place in Poland, "Asking about Future Global and Local Problems in Human Life", on 18th March 2016.

Regional Action Centers (RACs)

- Since the last newsletter, many exciting developments have taken place. Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) have been signed with Ibadan, Nigeria; Hiroshima, Japan; Teheran, Iran; Genoa, Italy; Lueneburg, Germany; Santiago de Compostela, Spain, and Taipei, Taiwan;
- Over the past three months numerous RACs have had their official opening ceremonies: Beijing, China; Washington, USA; New Dehli, India; Santiago de Compostela, Spain; Geona, Italy, and Taipei, Taiwan. Belgrade, Serbia, Vilnius, Lithuania, and Tunis, Tunisia, Buenos Aires, Argentina, Hamilton, New Zealand and Melbourne, Australia have started their activities in the last weeks.



- A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed for a Global Action Center with Mémoire de l'Avenir, Paris, France, and a Regional Action Program in Riydah, Saudi Arabia.
- Plans to establish RACs in Praia, Cape Verde; Kigali, Rwanda; Dubai; Lima, Peru; Havana, Cuba; Bogota, Colombia; Hong Kong, China, and Seoul, South Korea, to name but a few, are underway.
- All in all 31 RAC's in action, with another 15 we are in negotiations


